

Latch the Hatch (LTH) is a voluntary program with participation by several UPA member companies operating in the Uinta Basin. LTH participating companies have each signed a commitment statement and selected from a menu of options for actions the company commits to fulfill to reduce emissions of VOC and NOx, which can lead to ozone pollution.

The program started as an effort to always ensure closure of thief hatches on tanks, as any open hatches can be a source of emissions. It rapidly expanded to include additional actions such as:

- Conducting flyovers to detect emissions so that operators can fix leaks
- Modifying or replacing equipment operated by natural gas to eliminate emissions
- Installing solar powered equipment to eliminate emissions from engines and compressed gas
- Upgrading gaskets on tank hatches to reduce deterioration and installing alarms to indicate when a hatch has been left open
